College of Commerce & Economics (Autonomous) in collaboration with the office of the Principal, the Registrar & other concerned departments inform the students about various support services which can be availed by the students. The cell from time to time releases information about various Govt. Schemes regarding student scholarships such as Mukhyamantri Medhavi yojna, scholarship for SC , ST and OBC students etc. The IQAC also takes up follow up with the concerned department in college to ensure that students are provided with the facilities.
- The IQAC cell also coordinates with the training and placement department to organise various programmes for enhancing the soft skills, employability, and personality development of the students. Experts from the corporate world as well as entrepreneurs from surrounding areas are invited to share the experience and knowledge with the students.
- IQAC cell uses the digital medium to reach out to the students by using messaging software(MYSMSMANTRA) by which all the students are kept updated with notice regarding classes, time tables, events,information related to examination through etc which the students can get information on their fingertips. The college also has a dedicated facebook page to reach out to students and other stakeholders through social media.

5.2 Efforts made by the institution for tracking the progression

- To track the progress of the students around the year the institution holds Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation, quiz, group discussion and management games. The results of these examinations are analysed closely to see the progress of the students.
- The students are regularly provided one on one feedback from the concerned faculties of different subjects and inform them about their strengths and weaknesses.
- The parents are also very important stakeholders in this process thus they are also kept regularly updated about the performance of their wards through parent teacher meetings.
- The parents are also encouraged to regularly visit college campus and interact with the principal and other faculties to share their concerns and suggestions which they feel are important for development of their children.
- The student are also provided with one to one doubt clearing sessions for specific subjects, For slow learners subject teachers coach such students in subjects in

which they are weak such classes called remedial classes are organized for these students.

- The institution also conducts bridge courses for the students from science and arts background for making them well versed and familiar with basic concepts of subjects such as accounting, management, economics etc.
- The progress and competence of the faculty members is also judged through the analysis of results and they are also advised by the administration on the same.
- The students are encouraged to participate in inter class sports. A qualified sports officer looks after the sports activities and encourages the students to participate in inter-college sports events .Due to the efforts of the sports officer ,professor-in-charge of sports ,sports committee and the hard work put in by the students many of the students have participated in inter-university sports events ,national sports events ,some of whom have won medals .Various workshops, training programmes and events are organised to enhance the cultural activities which motivate students to participate in cultural events and maintain a healthy cultural environment in the institution.

8.8 Details of gender sensitization programmes

e) Priyadarshan Dharmadhikari Medal is given to the M.A (Economics) final year students of the institution achieving the first position.

5. **Evidence of Success:-** The healthy practice started by the institution has motivated many students to pursue their academic goals.

6. **Problems encountered and resource required:-** As the merit list of toppers was not generated by R.D.V.V. on time it became difficult to give the medals to students well in time.

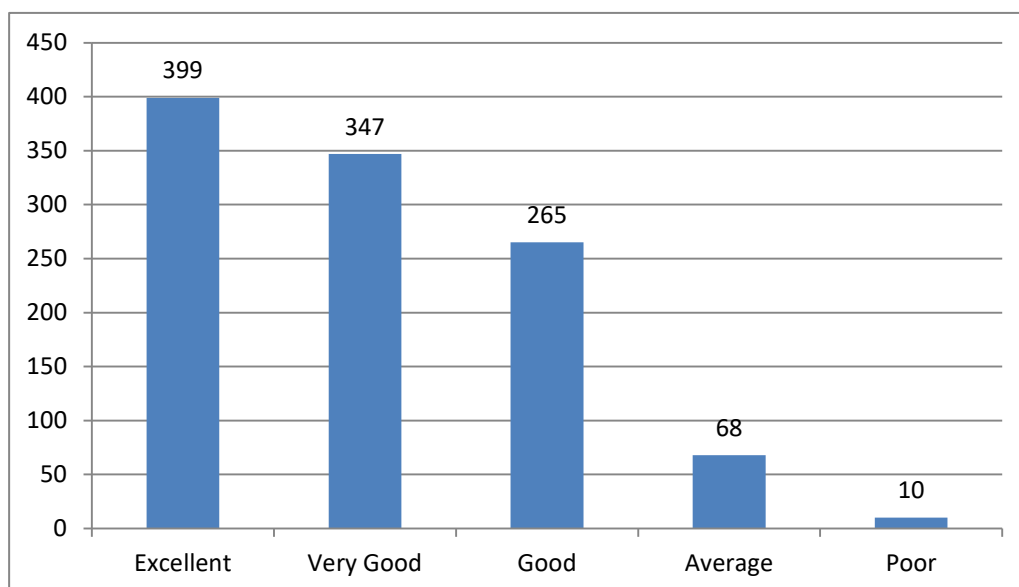
Feedback from Employers:-

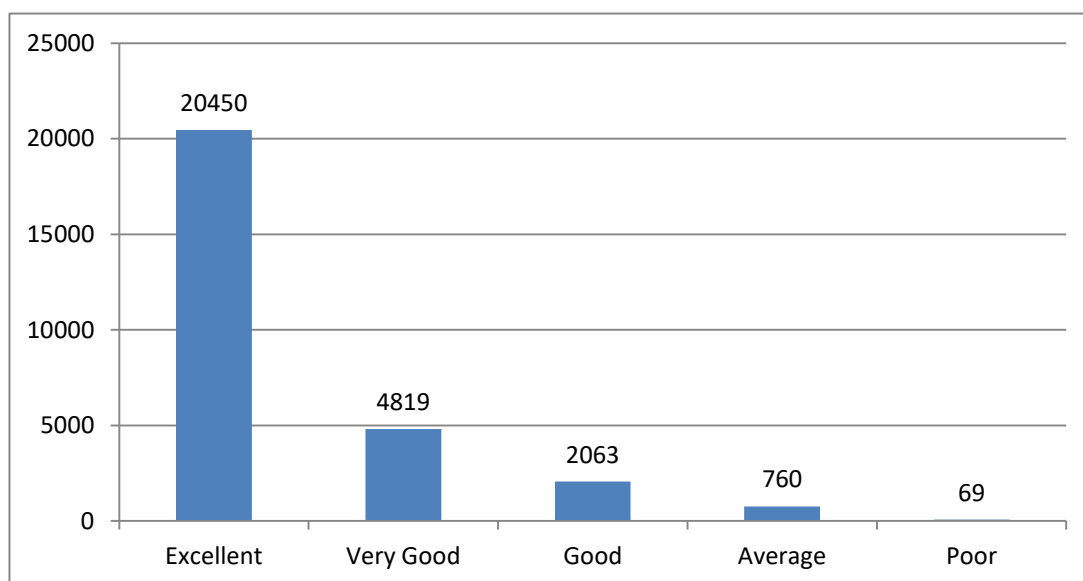
Feedback from Placements:-
